THE PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Hello fellow callers. For those of you who don't know me, I am Mike's older brother. I'm not the social butterfly that Mike is, but I am working on it. I also feel that I'm not the best at speaking or writing, so please be patient with me. Hopefully by this time next year I will be better. I was born and raised in Arizona. I have been married for 11 years to my better half Elizabeth. I have 2 sons, Michael 27, and Clayton 8. Last year we were blessed with a daughter Abigail. I joined the APC in 1995. I had always wanted to learn to call coyotes. I have hunted deer, elk, turkey, & javelina, but I find predator hunting the most exciting. I've learned many things since joining the club. Leonard Colpits was kind enough to take me hunting many times. Also, Jeff Serdy has taught me a lot. I think that I have most of it figured out, but I am always willing to learned new techniques.

I have done my fair share of hunting alone, but I now have a new partner Rocky. He is a Jagd Terrier that weighs 28 pounds and thinks he is Godzilla. He's still learning about coyotes, but he is coming along great. The first part of December I almost lost Rocky to a pack of javelina. He was torn up really bad and I had a huge vet bill, but he has recovered fine.

I recently took Rocky to the *Fur Donation Hunt*, which was held on January 8th. My day began at daylight just outside of Prescott. It was snowing when I did my first stand. I called for about a minute and waited for two minutes. I saw a coyote coming, he looked like he would run past me. I thought I would have to bark at him, when he turned and was running toward me. He was about a hundred and fifty yards out when I took the easy shot. What a

relief it was to have bagged one at the first stand. By this time it was raining and there was nothing but mud. The roads were nothing but mud. I was looking for a good place to pull off the road in my 2-wheel drive pickup. I found a few spots to pull over, where I thought I wouldn't get stuck. On the fourth stand I called for about fifteen minutes. I gave up and started to gather my things, when a coyote started loping across the snow right at me. He was about ten yards away when he figured me out. He took off running the other way. I took the shot and rolled him about forty yards out. That was number two!! I did a few more stands in the blizzard/rainstorm and then headed to the check-in.

The temperature gotten up to about 50 degrees and there was nothing but MUD, MUD & more MUD!!!

Congratulations to those of you who made it to the check-in. There were only four or five coyotes brought in that day and I had two! George Seff, Mike Huffer and I skinned the coyotes. There was table after table of food. Plenty for all.

I would like to thank George and Cindy Seff for their hospitality. "You guys are great!!" A few people got stuck and most of the next day was spent getting them unstuck. It did not freeze that night so I got up and left and was home by 11am. It was a tough hunt, but well worth it!!

In closing, I look forward to seeing you all at the next meeting. I would also like to thank Mike Kannapel for recruiting our last guest speaker Reed Peterson. I really enjoyed listening to him.

I'm still working on my ending.

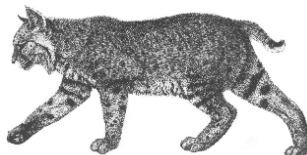

SAVE A FAWN HUNT INFO

The Save A Fawn Coyote Calling Event originally scheduled for January 15 & 16, 2005, has been postponed to February 26th and 27th.

The *Arizona Deer Association* in cooperation with the *Arizona Predator Callers*, the *Arizona Elk Society*, the *Antelope Foundation* with support from the *Arizona Game & Fish Department* would like to invite you and your organization to take part in our hunt.

This is a hunt with the purpose of helping the prey species and fawn recruitment in these units. Everyone that participates will receive a raffle ticket, you will also receive a raffle ticket for every predator checked in. We will have door prizes and a chance at \$50.00 drawings to help with the rising cost of gas. There will be no entry fee for this hunt and dinner will be provided on Saturday and Sunday for all that take part. The *Arizona Trappers Association* will be on hand to skin any animals that get checked in. *Arizona Game & Fish* will be there to collect scientific data from the animals collected to establish age and population specifics.

We held an event this spring and with the success of that hunt we made the decision to make this an annual event. We can concentrate in these units to bring some much needed help to the prey species that live in this habitat. The following are the fawn to doe numbers from AG&F:

- Unit 2A - 18 fawns to 100 does
- Unit 2B - 19 to 100
- Unit 2C - 5 to 100
- Unit 3C - 24 to 100
- Unit 3A - 16 to 100
- Unit 3B - I didn't get a count but it also needs help.
- Unit 4A - 21 to 100
- Unit 4B - 22 to 100

My name is Matt Nolan and I used to be a member of the APC club, unfortunately my job has taken me out of Arizona and I'm now hunting coyotes in Idaho.

I always check the APC website to keep in touch with what is going on down there. I can't tell you how much I miss my HOT spots in Arizona, and I can't wait to get back there on a weekend or two to just do some predator calling.

The hunting up here in Idaho is outstanding, it took awhile to find out the areas that were good for predator calling, but thanks to a few people who can't keep a secret I am back in business, and in the last year I have taken approximately 30 dogs and that's no fishing story either!

My son and I are hunting in a very remote area where the coyotes are not too educated, the only problem at this time of year is the deep snow. So we have been using snowshoes to get to

and from our calling stands. I have one particular stand that we have taken 7 dogs in a row. I admit that we are over hunting that particular spot but since it keeps supplying the coyotes we go back to it about every 30 days or so.

One thing I would like to mention is that I have given up my electronic caller and totally use manual calls. My success ratio has risen drastically and I will never go back to an electronic call again. Besides I didn't like packing the thing anyway!

The only thing I can say about Idaho that is disappointing is that there is no predator calling club up here, which is very surprising to me.

One final thing, I would be happy to take any interested members of the club out hunting up here if they are ever in the area.

Hunters, we suggest you hunt in these game management units:

- > 7 > 15A/B
- > 8 > 18A
- > 9 > 18B
- > 10 > 19A-19B

However, you can hunt in any game management units with antelope hunts.

Information

The hunt will be conducted over a two-day period, March 05-06, 2005. Drawing for the prizes will be as follows: each team that enters will receive a single red ticket when they check in Saturday night. Each coyote checked in will result in that team receiving another red ticket. Half of the total prize money will then be awarded through random drawings of those tickets starting at 9:10 p.m., Saturday night.

This process will be repeated on Sunday at 2:10 p.m. with the remaining prize money being dispersed.
